- Will allow those in receipt of Health Data Research UK funds to use their funding to pay an open access fee (e.g. article processing charges, where appropriate, to meet these principles.
- Encourages – and where it pays an open access fee, require – authors and publishers to licence research papers using the Creative Commons Attribution licence (CC-BY) so they may be freely copied and re-used (for example, for text and data-mining purposes or creating a translation), provided that such uses are fully attributed.
- Encourages outputs published in a peer-reviewed journal, and supported in whole or in part by Health Data Research UK funding, to be made available through PubMed Central (PMC) and Europe PMC as soon as possible and in any event within six months of the journal publisher’s official date of final publication.
- Expects data outputs, such as algorithms/software, to be uploaded to the Health Data Research UK GitHub Organisation repository (<https://github.com/HDRUK>) and made available to an open permissive licence (such as Apache Licence 2.0, MIT, MPL or BSD).
